# Keynote Speakers



## Bill Atkinson - MD, MPH



Dr. William Atkinson is a Medical Epidemiologist in the National Immunization Program at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in Atlanta, Georgia. He has worked in public health his entire professional career, first with the Louisiana State Health Department in New Orleans and, since 1989, with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in Atlanta. He has conducted more than 50 vaccine training courses, given more than 500 invited lectures on immunization, and is the principal writer and presenter for 83 nationwide satellite broadcasts on vaccine-preventable diseases. These courses have been attended by more than 250,000 health care providers throughout the country.



## Donna L. Weaver, MN, RN

Donna Weaver is the Nurse Educator for the Education, Information and Partnership Branch at CDC. Donna earned her Master's Degree in Nursing at the University of South Carolina at Columbia. Before coming to CDC in 2000, Donna practiced nursing throughout the U.S. and also in Saudi Arabia. 

# Immunization Quick Facts

1. On average, 1.3 million infants and young children die every year from pneumococcal disease and rotavirus.
2. Major breakthroughs are now occurring worldwide in the development of new vaccines. There are about 20 vaccines currently in use. Another 20 new or improved vaccines are expected to be available by 2015.
3. Worldwide, deaths caused by measles have been reduced by about two-thirds between 2000 and 2006 as a result of immunizations.
4. There were 64 cases of measles confirmed between January and May 1, 2008. This is the highest number of cases in the U.S. during the same time period since 2001.
  - Of the 64 cases, 63 occurred in people who were not immunized or whose immunization status could not be confirmed.
  - The cases have occurred in nine states, including New York (23), AZ (15), CA (12), MI (4), WI (4), HI (3), IL (1), PA (1), and VA (1).
  - Thirteen cases occurred in children too young to be immunized.
  - Children 16 months to 19 years for whom exemptions were claimed accounted for two-thirds of the cases.
  - Ten cases were imported and 44 additional cases were associated with those importations.
  - Of the 10 importations, 5 were in U.S. citizens who went to other countries and 5 were in travelers to the U.S.
  - The countries associated with these cases included Belgium, China, India, Israel, Italy, and Switzerland.
5. The first vaccine, smallpox, was developed in the 18th century, 4 vaccines were developed in the 19th century, 33 were developed in the 1900s, and so far, 6 have been developed since 2000. All of these were made in one of 4 ways:
  - Live viruses were weakened, so they did not cause illness.
  - The organism was killed, but given in its entirety.
  - Part of the organism was used as the vaccine. Sometimes, other proteins were attached to make a stronger immune response.
  - Disease-causing toxins produced by the bacteria were chemically inactivated and used as the vaccine.
6. Immunizations currently save between 2 and 3 million lives per year. It is one of the most successful and cost-effective public health interventions.
7. About 10 million children under the age of 5 die every year worldwide. One quarter of these deaths are caused by diseases that can be prevented with vaccines.
