Dear Capital High School Community,

We recently learned that a limited number of students and staff at Capital High School may have been exposed to a person with tuberculosis (TB) during January through May of the 2018-19 school year. This person is no longer affiliated with Capital High School or the Boise School District. **At this time, there is NO known ongoing risk for TB exposure at Capital High School.**

Central District Health (CDH) and the school are working together to determine who may have had a possible exposure. CDH has contacted persons directly by mail who they have determined may have been exposed to the active case of TB and provided further information about evaluation and testing. Letters were mailed on Wednesday, September 25, 2019. **No persons other than those contacted directly by CDH will need to take action.**

Again, those who may have been exposed have been provided information by Central District Health regarding evaluation and testing.

Though not recommended by CDH unless you are contacted directly, should you wish to be tested, CDH and many local health care providers offer TB testing.
