This program identifies community partners, implements policy and environmental strategies to address substance misuse, facilitates overdose prevention education, and coordinates with organizations and stakeholders throughout the community to improve community health.



Technical Assistance, Education, Training, & Material Development

Partner on community-based education opportunities, drugtake back events, and social media messaging, including special opportunities for law enforcement, first responders, and crisis systems.



Overdose Prevention & Response Training

Learn about overdose prevention strategies, including overdose risk factors, alternative pain management, safe prescription storage and disposal. Learn how to recognize and respond to an overdose, including the administration of two forms of naloxone.




Certificates of Attendance

Receive credit for personal, professional and organizational skill development at Overdose Prevention and Response Trainings.



Overdose Response Supplies

Free overdose rescue kits for organizations, potential overdose bystanders, and individuals in need. Kits include CPR mask, gloves, alcohol wipes, and resource cards. By request, intramuscular naloxone hard cases and pulse oximeters.



Virtual Resource Library

Free, interactive digital archive including resources, education, training, and guidance with evidence-based, upto-date information and practices. Explore interactive rooms with multimedia overdose prevention and response education resources.



Safe Sharps Disposal

Providing education to reduce accidental needlestick injury and prevent the spread of infectious disease.



Community Asset Map

Free, interactive online regional resource map to support access to substance use prevention, treatment, and recovery support services, harm reduction resources, and other community relief (social determinants of health) services.

Community Impact

- Provided technical assistance, education, training and material development to 17 organizations
- Provided 74 hours of technical assistance or education to 23
 public safety partners, implementing 13 overdose prevention or
 response activities
- Facilitated 31 trainings, reaching a total of 334 participants
- Awarded 130 certificates of attendance
- Distributed 187 overdose rescue kits across all counties
- Participated in 6 additional opportunities reaching 256
 participants
